For the academic year 2023/2024, Eton Wick had an allocated fund to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of Physical Education and Sport.

Our allocation this year was £16,550.00

Actual spend: £17,016.98

Our continued aim is to engage all of our pupils in Physical Education and make additional improvements to ensure that the capacity of physical education is embedded within our school. The outline of our spending for this academic year can be found below:

Key indicator: 1,2,3,4,5	Cost: £7550
Activity/Resource	Impact
School Games	We achieved the Gold Mark for the fifth year in a row.
Competitions and festivals	Continue to engage with pupil participation in local sports festivals and competitions. Children experience competing against other schools and develop competitive games skills. During festivals, children are given the opportunity to improve their skills in key fundamentals. Competitions/festivals attended: Bench ball, skipping, football, tag rugby, dance festival, tennis, summer games. Every child in Year 3 and 4 has attended at least 1 competition/festival this academic year.
CPD programme	Training and updates for staff members to further develop their skills in school across the year. Teachers able to assess children's skills and plan accordingly. PLT sessions 6 x ½ day.



	Staff who attended the training cascaded training to the rest of the staff as part of CPD sessions in school, and development of leadership in un specialised areas of the curriculum.
Leadership	Providing children with the opportunity to promote activities at lunch time through the Sports Leaders. They attend a training course provided by WSSP and are responsible for the organisation of multi-skills activities and competition amongst their peers. Children learn how to develop sports leadership skills. Children trained, Staff cover for sports leader training Sports leader board also created to 'show' everyone who the sports leaders are
Active Me	ActiveMe is a targeted afterschool club which helps to teach pupils ways to lead healthy and active lifestyles. It uses physical activity, problem solving and games to educate children about physical, mental, social and emotional health. We chose 12 children from both KS1 and KS2, and it ran for 6 weeks. They learned what is healthy and unhealthy, what an active lifestyle looks like to them, and what changes they can make to be healthier.
Healthy Minds	The Healthy Minds programme is taught to children in Year 3 and 4 over a period of 6 weeks. Children are taught to understand that we all have a mental health, and how we need to take care of it. Children are given the tools on how they can talk about it at school, at home or with our friends and how we can help ourselves and/or people around us. It is a unique chance for children to talk about their emotions, how their feelings change and how our mental health can affect our everyday life and wellbeing.

Sports Day and Sports Events

Key indicator: 1,4,5

Cost: £328

Activity/Resource	Impact
Sports Day Stickers (£20)	Ensure that all children are encouraged and rewarded for participation rather than winning.
Line markings (£308)	Running track lines on the field to give children a real-life context with running races. Football pitch marked out in the winter for clubs and school curriculum.

Activity/Resource	Impact
PE indoor Inspection (£70)	Safety of our indoor benches, and climbing equipment
PE outdoor inspection (£95)	Ensuring the safety of our outdoor equipment; trim trail and slides
Equipment insurance (255)	To ensure the safety of all pupils
PE Equipment (£702.98)	Basketball hoops, bean bags, hoops, balls, skipping ropes for lunchtime and playtime, crates

Activity/Resource	Impact
Clubs (£1,942)	To offer a wide range of clubs, led by staff and external coaches to promote and to ensure that children stay interested and inquisitive about health, life skills, fitness and nutrition. Throughout the year, we offered: cookery, wheelie club, football, dance, multi-skills, We have included the purchasing of resources and staff cover needed to run these activities. The majority of pupils are engaged in extracurricular activities.
Offsite activity insurance (£67)	Ensuring all trips are covered out of school
PGL Activity Centre (£500)	Financial support to aid families in being able to send their children on an activity week, broadening children's experiences.

Training, CPD and Staffing

Key indicator: 3

Cost: £5507

Activity/Resource	Impact
WSSP competitions (£375)	Staff to enable the children to take part in the competitions. We took part in 14 festivals/competitions over the year.
Real PE (£695)	A programme to support every child from Reception to Year 4 to develop the physical literacy, emotional and thinking skills to achieve in PE. This is taught every week in 6 week blocks over the academic year.
Additional adult (£3785)	The use of an additional adult to support and lead games and activities at lunchtime, enabling all children to be active.
Staff cover (£652)	A member of staff to cover a class during PLT afternoons (x6)
